Exemption Criteria for English Courses

Bachelor of Science in Information and Communication Technology

(International Program), year 2021

According to the curriculum of the Bachelor of Science in Information and Communication Technology (International Program), Faculty of Information and Communication Technology, students are required to select 12 credits of language courses in the General Education Courses. To ensure the smooth operation of exemption of the English courses for those students whose English Proficiency Test Scores meet the criteria of the courses, the Faculty of Information and Communication Technology has cancelled the previous Announcement of the Faculty of Information and Communication Technology, Mahidol University regarding the Exemption Criteria for English Courses of the Bachelor of Science in Information and Communication Technology (International Program), year 2020 dated 8 September 2020 and determined the revised exemption criteria for English courses. This announcement is according to the resolution passed in the Faculty Committee Meeting 1/2021 on 27 January 2021, as follows:

Remark: The English test scores must be valid upon submission, which is two years from the exam result announcement date.

2. Procedures

2.1 A student registers for ITLG101 Technical English I, or ITLG102 Technical English II, or ITLG201 Reading Skills according to the study plan.

2.2 A student, whose English Proficiency Test scores meet the criteria according to the table above, submits the scores as mentioned in No. 1 with the Request Form for Exemption of English courses to the Academic Services Division. The request will be passed to the Program Committee for consideration and approval. The student has to submit the request within 1 week after the semester starts.

2.3 The Faculty of Information and Communication Technology announces the list of students who receive the exemption of English courses after 1 week when the semester starts.


3. Grades

3.1 A student who gets an exemption for ITLG101 Technical English I, or ITLG102 Technical English II, or ITLG201 Reading Skills, will receive an 'S' grade which can be counted for cumulative credits, but not for cumulative GPA.

3.2 If a student who gets an exemption for ITLG101 Technical English I, or ITLG102 Technical English II, or ITLG201 Reading Skills, would like to get letter grades; A, B+, B, C+, or C which can be counted for cumulative credits for graduation and for cumulative GPA, the student has to take a test in accordance with the conditions of that course.

This announcement is effective since 2nd semester of academic year 2020.
